A New Chapter on the Northwest Side

The future of Tacos La Flamita is looking bright—and stationary. Jimenez Mendoza recently purchased a standalone building at **2100 W. Hopkins St.** for \$235,000, signaling a transition from the rolling kitchen to a brick-and-mortar storefront.

The site, a compact building that previously housed Pizza House and Haji's Red Hot, is currently undergoing plans to be transformed into a streamlined, counter-service hub. According to filings submitted to the Milwaukee Common Council, the new spot will move away from the traditional sit-down dining model, focusing instead on quick service and convenient pickup for those on the go.

What's on the Menu?

While the footprint of the restaurant may change, the soul of the menu isn't going anywhere. Plans suggest a robust selection of favorites, including:

- **The Classics:** Tacos al pastor, tortas, and handmade huaraches.
- **The Essentials:** Birria, gorditas, and crispy quesadillas.
- **The Proteins:** A wide variety of traditional meats, ranging from asada and chorizo to tripe, tongue, and cabeza.

The new location will be a dry establishment, focusing entirely on flavor rather than alcohol service, and will utilize the property's surface lot to ensure a seamless experience for curbside order pickups.

Don't Panic—The Truck is Still Rolling

If you're worried about a gap in your taco intake, fret not. The transition to the new location is currently in the licensing and permitting phase. As Jimenez Mendoza works through the necessary city approvals, the Tacos La Flamita truck will continue its usual rounds.

Fans can still track down their favorite mobile meal—typically stationed near **1920 W. National Ave.**—or find them via delivery platforms like DoorDash, which feature an extensive mobile menu including burritos, tostadas, alambres, nachos, and sopes.

Why It Matters

For a business that started on the streets, moving into a permanent space is a testament to the loyalty of Milwaukee's food scene. By anchoring themselves on Hopkins Street, Tacos La Flamita isn't just opening a new business; they are revitalizing a piece of property that has been quiet since 2020 and bringing a high-demand, community-focused food option to the Northwest Side.

While we wait for the final green light from the Milwaukee Common Council, keep an eye on the asphalt. The truck is still there, serving up the best of what's to come!
